She is a member of Sustainable Tulsa and is on the Executive Committee of Green Country Sierra Club. As a Sustainable Tulsa Scorecard Coach for 2020, Julie worked with Congregation B'nai Emunah to improve their congregation's green footprint. A passionate gardener, she is a Linnaeus Master Gardener.
