


Join us.

What: The Interfaith March for Peace & Justice is a positive, non-partisan event meant to give voice to the following proposition: "It is our intention to affirm the freedom of religion (guaranteed by the 1st Amendment of the U.S. Constitution) and to condemn all acts of discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or violence directed at people because of their religion, race, or place of origin."

Who: We invite all people of good will who agree with our proposition to join us, regardless of their faith background (or lack thereof). We require only that all marchers be committed to carrying out a peaceful, non-partisan event. We strongly encourage the involvement of youth activists, whose dedication, energy, and ideas we value.



When: From coast to coast, marches will have a

coordinated start time on **April 29.** Marches will begin at **4:30 ET, 3:30 CT, 2:30 MT, and 1:30 PT** so that we lift our voices up simultaneously in the name of Peace and Justice.

How does it work? Organizers in each location will pick a starting point and a march for their route. They will then enlist as many co-sponsoring organizations and individuals as they can. Details for the multiple steps in the organizing process are laid out in a set of "Assembly Guidelines," which can be found at **interfaithmarch.com**. On April 29, we all take to the streets and start our events at the same time (a la "Hands Across America").

How do I get involved? If an event is already taking place in your area, find out when planning meetings are taking place and lend a hand. There are many different jobs that go into making an event happen successfully; many hands will make light work for everyone.
